

Presser Foot	I use an open toe-foot	
Tension	I always loosen the top tension a tiny bit – just so the thread "dots" appear on	
	the back of the block and not the front. By loosening the top tension (and using	
	the larger stitch length listed above), it also eliminates the need for a stabilizer.	
Options	Many machines have different options to help make the process easier, such as	
	the needle-down button, mirror image, half-speed, double blanket stitch, etc.	
Securing	To secure your stitching when doing the small zig zag, you can do several	
	stitches in place and then trim the ends. For the topstitching/heavy thread, leave	
	the tails when starting and stopping and pull them to the back of the block. Tie a	
	double knot and then trim.	

^{**} I use the Heavy weight thread made by Dual Duty/Coats and Clark. It used to be called Topstitching thread.

ALIGNMENT OF STITCHING

To begin, align your stitching as shown, keeping the stitching almost entirely on the appliqué shape and going just over the edge into the ditch where the appliqué and background meet. The goal is to just barely cover the edge of the fabric, keeping the bulk of the stitching on the appliqué shape.




OUTSIDE POINTS

You will use a different approach for your points, depending on which stitch you are using.

Stitch up to the pivot point. Stitch up to stopping point. Stitch up to stopping point. Pivot and take one stitch. Pivot and continue stitching. Pivot and continue stitching.
